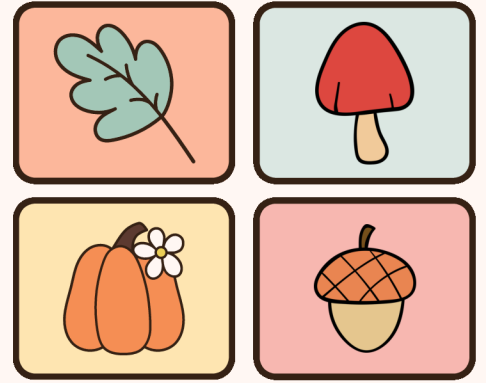

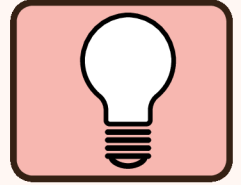

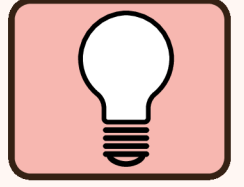
Each child contributed two slides to a shared Google presentation, applying skills in inquiry, teamwork, and responsible technology use.

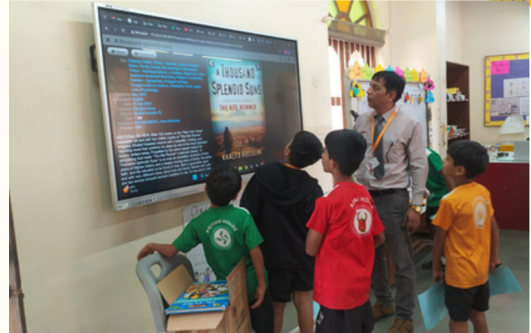
# GUEST SESSION

# VERBS

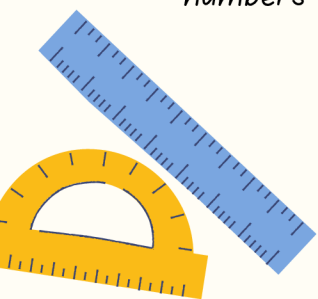
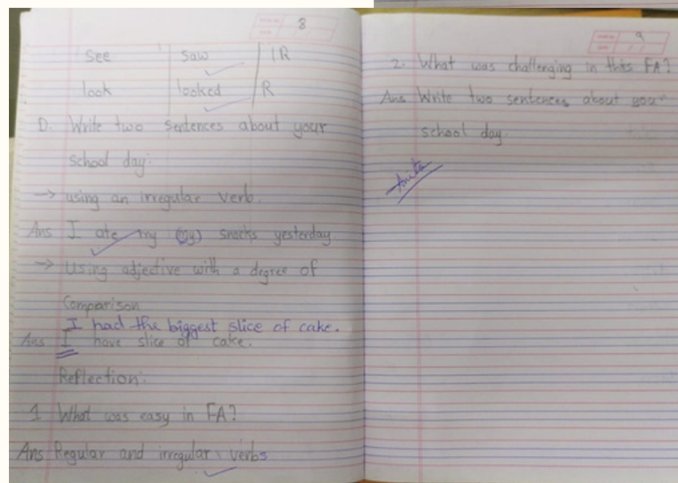
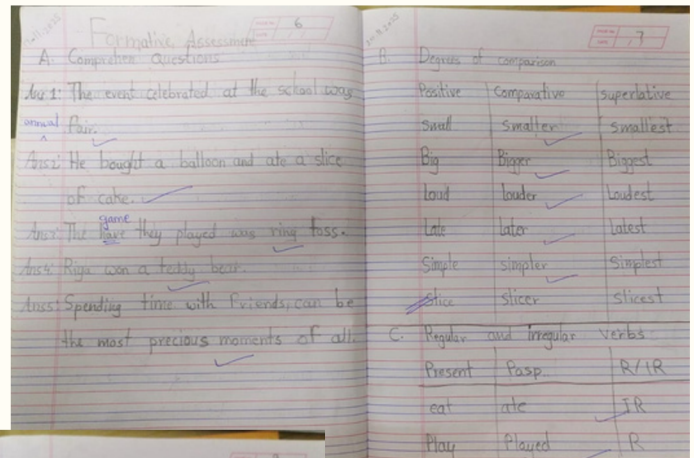

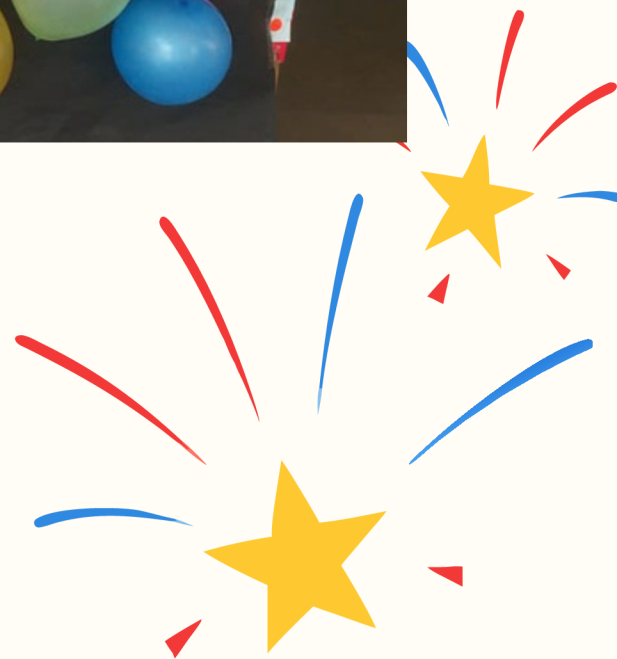


# Children's day
