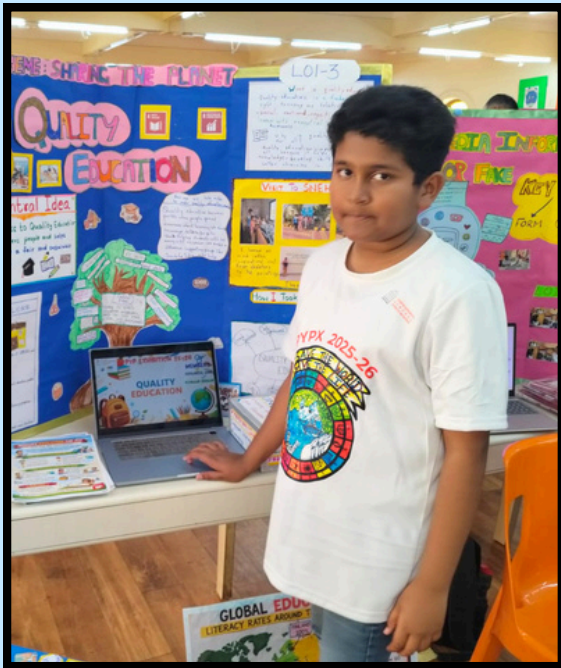





PYP EXHIBITION

The session was both insightful and engaging, strengthening connections across grade levels and inspiring our learners as they continue their own Exhibition journey.



WASTE MANAGEMENT AND COMPOSTING SWACHH



Our PYP students participated in an enriching learning session on waste management and composting, conducted by the Swachh Organisation. The session aimed to build awareness about sustainable waste practices and the importance of responsible waste management for protecting our environment. Students experienced a hands-on demonstration where they learned how to layer kitchen waste and garden waste to create compost (manure). Through the demo, they understood the correct process of layering organic waste and soil to turn everyday kitchen garbage into useful compost for plants. The session was highly interactive, with students actively asking questions and sharing their thoughts. They also learned to identify compostable waste, biodegradable but non-compostable waste, and non-compostable waste, which helped them understand how to manage waste more responsibly. To encourage students to practice these sustainable habits at home, the resource persons also distributed Swachh composting brochures that guide families on how to start composting using kitchen waste. Overall, it was a meaningful and engaging learning experience that inspired our students to take small but impactful steps towards a cleaner and more sustainable environment.
